Doc's Book Club

There is an expression that says that "every man has one vice." I have one; books! Out of my vast library (would you believe I have nine bookcases? - six of which are 8 feet tall), I have read over 2000 non-fiction Christian books and researched/written over 130 papers for school assignments. As much as I believe that the Word of God (aka the Bible) is the final Word on issues, and should not be "interpreted" (just read it!), reading from good authors can educate and confirm the Word. I have made recommendations periodically throughout this calendar, and with a few exceptions, I do not personally know the authors, but I do know their credentials and reputations.

I use the New King James Version and for explaining issues and for ease of understanding I like the New International Version, which is the version I quote most often in this publication. There is nothing wrong with The Living Bible as a good comparison and the Message and Passion versions are fun to read. If you are a beginner, I suggest the Living Bible for starters. Read (in this order) Ephesians, James, Romans, 1 and 2 Corinthians, Colossians, Hebrews, then John, Luke, Mark, and Matthew. Next, finish the rest of the New Testament, and then start at the beginning of the Old Testament. As you're doing this, find a gospel preaching, faith teaching, spirit filled church and go!

Note to Readers

Following Holy Spirit's direction, I took a course that I wrote called, "Biblical Economics 101" and expanded it into a book of the same title. Now, after a year of prayer and writing, He has guided me through the steps to produce this devotional. The direction that I have been given is to stimulate thought; perhaps, be somewhat provocative; have you conduct a self-analysis; - in other words, get you thinking! Isn't that what Jesus did?

What you are about to read, I did not write. Honestly, I am not that smart! All credit goes to Holy Spirit who gave me the idea to make a daily devotional. I wrote the first 15 days and then said to myself, "well that's all I can write; so much for that project" and proceeded to put it on the back burner. But God had other plans... This calendar/book was written by Holy Spirit; not by me. So please enjoy and reflect on His Words, not mine. I have written these challenging thoughts, tests and ideas as much for myself as for any of you; trust me I have!

Out of respect for my Canadian heritage, I am retaining my Canadian culture in the writing style and the spelling of some words. So, dear reader, please do not think this book has typos! (hopefully you will not find any!) We Canadians spell some words differently (or "correctly" as we believe!) from the rest of the world.

No doubt that this devotional will stimulate some thoughts and questions in your mind (at least I hope so). Please feel free to email me with any and all questions that you may have and I will do my upmost to answer them; and before you ask, there is no charge (you already bought the book!) As I am sure you can imagine, trying to write what is essentially a sermon in less than 300 words has turned out to be quite a challenge! (I say 300 because that is approximately how much space I have per page.) Therefore, on many occasions I've had to extend it to part one, part two, part three, etc. of the same

topic. It was not my intention to write a devotional with a "hook" at the end of each day to keep you reading! It is not a "marketing ploy!" It's just that sometimes you simply "can't say what you gotta say" in 300 words! Something you'll notice if you have not already, is that I always refer to Holy Spirit as "Holy Spirit"; I never refer to Him as "the Holy Spirit." That is because Holy Spirit, is not a "thing" or an "it"; Holy Spirit is a person - part of the Trinity of God (Father, Son, Holy Spirit). I do not believe that referring to Holy Spirit as a "the" fits the person of God that Holy Spirit exemplifies.

I refuse to capitalize the name satan. I know that that is grammatically incorrect, but satan doesn't deserve the honour; and besides, it's my project. He has done everything he can to stop the publication of it, so this is one of my revenges to him.

Embrace Change.

I guess it depends upon one's point of view, but I feel that if you are not changing then you are not growing. Start a journal; write notes to yourself about your mistakes, your successes, your dreams and then write your goals. No goals? Go away on a personal retreat weekend (with or without your spouse) and just spend time alone with God and ask Him about goals. What does He want you to be doing? Pray about your finances; what would He have you do with them? Would He have you start a budget or investing plan? When you have your goal(s), set it all in motion.

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." (Jer. 29:11)

Who Are you Listening to?

If you are "hearing" but it is not from God, then who are you listening to? The devil will never give you peace, only Jesus can do that. Here are some guidelines: The Fathers voice stills you, reassures you, enlightens you, forgives you, calms you, encourages you, and comforts you. All of these emotions will fill you with peace, joy and security. Your "seemer" will tell you that if you're ever unsure yourself. (see Acts 15:28; 34 NKJV)

Satan's voice: rushes you, frightens you, confuses you, condemns you, stresses you, discourages you, and worries you. All of these emotions are negative, are the opposite of peace, will keep you awake at night and give you nothing but fear. THAT is not of God....

Sometimes we encounter feelings that are neither of these things. It's in those times we must wait on the Lord and His guidance. At times, it may just be ourselves and our own thoughts, but as we spend more time with Him we begin to recognize the Father's voice which the enemy can not take away from us because He has all authority over satan. (Mark 1:21-27) Spend more time with God and get to know His voice. Sometimes people will say, "I got a hunch about..." If that "hunch" is positive, it is from the Lord; if negative, it is probably from the devil.

The World is Full of Change; You can Change too!

Repentance is to change the way you think - your behaviour. God has placed in us a wonderful revelation; replace any destructive lies that you have believed with the pure truth from God. In our childhood, we were bombarded with a collage of good and bad thoughts - words spoken to us by ourselves and others; images from TV and computer screens etc. etc.

From that, we formed an image of ourselves; some of it good and some of it not so good. The bad stuff we think about ourselves inevitably leads us to do things that do not align with the Word of God. It is simply called "sin" and we are all guilty of it. Rom. 3:23 says, "for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." Actually, we are all born into sin;

Ps 51:5 says, "Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity. And in sin my mother conceived me." (NKJV) We can be set free from mindsets that have hindered us from our God ordained destiny by simply confessing those sins, asking God to forgive us (which He does) and then change and not do that anymore.

"He said to her, "Woman, where are those accusers of yours? Has no one condemned you?' She said, 'No one, Lord.' And Jesus said to her, 'Neither do I condemn you; go and sin no more.'" (John 8:10-11 NKJV)

Successful People are Kind and Fair

God wants to know how you are doing in the area of how you are treating others.

Loving others as we love ourselves is one of His biggest tests. (Mark 12:21) Do you have compassion for your fellow man? For people that are less fortunate than yourself? Giving money to people that are poorer than you is a sign of compassion.

The Bible is filled with stories of compassion in the Old Testament, and examples of the compassion of Jesus Christ are plentiful in the Gospels such as healing outcasts of society (Matt. 8:1-3), as well as dining with them. (Luke 19:1-10) These examples of compassion are a call and challenge to the followers of Jesus. They tell of a Savior who was willing to connect not just with the people of status, but they also show a Savior willing to suffer for the whole world, and who commands all of us to live and act compassionately.

"Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you." (Eph. 4:3)

"Blessed are those who act justly, who always do what is right." (Ps. 106:3)

Less Than 1% of the Church does this:

In Matthew chapter 6, Jesus gives three commandments and explains each one of them. Condensed, He said, "...when you pray...when you fast...when you give"...Most people understand the concept of prayer, although it seems to me that few people know how to do it correctly (more on that later). Same for giving, but fasting? What is that???

The purpose of fasting is not to lose weight (although that can be an added bonus for some of us!), nor to make your life miserable. The discipline of fasting releases the blessing of God in the life of a Christian. If you are not content to go through this year like you did last year, now is the time to fast to see breakthroughs. We fast to seek the will of God; the right way for us to go. As indicated in Ezra 8:21 we fast for substance. We fast to petition God about our resources; our finances and affirm to Him that He is our source. Fast to put your flesh under submission and hear from God. If only 1% of the church is doing this, then I guess only 1% are reaping the benefits. (aka blessings!)

Move On.

Don't waste your time and energy with regret; it is just not worth it. This includes forgiving yourself; one of life's hardest tasks, but it needs to be done. Ensure you have learned from your mistakes though! As my father used to say, "It is not a good day unless you learn something." We must avoid repeating the same mistakes. Tragically, many of us (myself included) will make the same mistakes over and over until we get it through our thick heads. It's only by the grace of God that He does not grow tired of reaching out to us.

Painfully, one of the biggest areas we struggle in forgiving ourselves is when we have lost or wasted money. It is something the church seldom talks of, and yet can easily bring darkness, or worse, pride, thinking that we know better than God in how to manage our finances. It can happen to anyone who is not grounded in God throughout the whole process. As we are not tied to our shortcomings in our past through the blood of Christ, so the same rule applies to our past financial mistakes. Learn from your mistakes and move on.

"For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins."
(Matt. 6:14-15)

Celebrate Others Success (even when you wish it was you).

This inability to celebrate with others begins with discontented jealousy. We really want something even to the point of making it into an idol; and then we see someone else getting it. Nothing seems to "burn us" more than when someone gets some type of financial blessing like a new house or car.

Proverbs 14:30 tell us what jealousy is like: "A heart at peace gives life to the body, but envy rots the bones." That bitterness inside of you eats at you. Notice that the scripture says "envy rots the bones." And then people wonder why they get sick. I can't tell you how many people I've met who had a bad case of bitterness that was like a cloud over them. These people get sick more often, often make impulsive decisions on money or on their relationships, and they become even more bitter! The cycle has to be broken somewhere. Forgive the other person, forgive yourself; and celebrating with those around you is a fantastic way to begin getting out of a cloud of bitterness and envy. It's so important we live free of this.

The lack of money causes more envy than anything I know of. Instead of envy, rejoice with the other person's success and have an "attitude of gratitude" for what God has blest you with.

God Loves You.

Do you love your kids? That's what we are to God; His kids. He loves you so very much, as if you were the only person that existed on the face of this earth. He really does love you that much. He wants you well in every part of your life. God can and will heal you. So, believe that your faith makes you whole. Your faith, and the healing power of the blood of Jesus.

Read Matt. 8:43-48. I'll paraphrase some of it; the passage tells of a woman who had a bleeding problem for twelve years, and she touched Jesus as He passed by in a crowd. Jesus stopped everyone because He felt power go from Him. "... Then the woman, seeing that she could not go unnoticed, came trembling and fell at his feet. In the presence of all the people, she told why she had touched Him and how she had been instantly healed. Then He said to her, 'Daughter, your faith has healed you. Go in peace.'"

Just believe what God's Word says. You see you are very special to Jesus because He paid a very dear praise for your salvation and your healing. Just like salvation, healing is a paid for gift, just for you. If you need healing right now, just reach out like a little child by faith and receive by faith. Trust God to do the rest by faith!
